Executive Director's Report (Pam Sullivan)

- Pam reviewed the 2019-2020 ED's section of Annual Report
 - Pam and Caitlin came on board in January and launched the Hub, which shut down in March. Filled 33-50 seats and moved content online.
 - April saw a new store renovation, which reopened in June. That month we resumed gallery shows and have had monthly gallery shows ever since. In addition, there have been three exhibitions for the new Arts at Adair satellite.
 - WREN received website grant from NH Women's Foundation and the new site launched Saturday with a full online store.
 - Applied for next round of CBDG Covid (25 seats) and COVID (25) Yard sale cleared out basement, built new wall. Waiting on grant to renovate spaces downstairs, collecting rental income.
 - Annual Appeal launches next week, going 7-days a week after thanksgiving, 10% off storewide and 25% one item (coming from WREN's pocket). Sales incentive for selling memberships. New website launched Saturday.
 - Membership is 187
- Member Vivian asked what is being done to support service businesses as well as retailers? Ideas brainstormed include surveying service business members and selling service vouchers during holiday sales weeks.
